

Villa with a view

With 90 golf holes to play and 25 polo tournaments a season, Sotogrande is a summer sports Mecca. Sophia Wilson discovers a palatial villa in progress that's ideal for active sophisticates

he private Andalusian estate of
Sotogrande has been a sun-soaked
haven for the wealthy since the
1960s. Now a new six-house
gated community, El Mirador offers privacy
with modern flair. The first of its pavilion-style
properties is nearing completion, while the
neighbouring Villa Vela is still on the market
and will be ready to move into for the 2020
Med season.

Designed by Andalusian architect Manuel Ruiz of ARK architects, the curving fivebedroom home is split over three floors with a contemporary style featuring clean lines, floor-to-ceiling windows and extensive outdoor living spaces. It's built around a tiered circular central terrace with an infinity pool and superb views out to sea. A bright, 1,494-square-metre interior will house a grand master suite, four en suite guest bedrooms, indoor swimming pool and a gym. It also has an additional bedroom for staff and undercover parking.

The owner will have access to the La Reserva Club's facilities, including its 18-hole Championship Golf Course, a tennis and padel club and The Beach, southern Europe's first freshwater swimming lagoon. Despite being five kilometres from the Med, The Beach still has sandy shores, a boho Beach Club that serves up killer cocktails and modern Spanish fare, and a watersports centre.

Created by American industrialist Colonel Joseph McMicking in 1962, Sotogrande has maintained its real-estate prowess. "Its allure lies in its position, abundance of space and spectacular views," says Marc Topiol, CEO of Sotogrande SA. "This, coupled with the fact that La Reserva Club is still within easy reach of busier towns such as Marbella, and Andalucia's cultural centres such as Seville, Córdoba and Cádiz, makes for a winning formula."

Villa Vela, El Mirador, La Reserva Sotogrande, is slated for completion in April 2020 and is for sale for €9.2 million, lareservaclubsotogrande.com



The lowdown

The Real Club de Maritimo de Sotogrande is less than 6.5km away, can host yachts up to 70 metres and has a busy regatta schedule during the summer. Gibraitar International Airport is less than 25km away and has private jet facilities. Annual golf tournaments at the La Reserva Club include the Couple's Tournament (4 August) and Parent and Child Tournament (12 August). This year also saw some of the top ladies in Europe play the Inaugural La Reserva de Sotogrande Invitational.

SOTOGRANDE

Andalucía, Spain

Credentials: The Sotogrande community was created in 1962 by Filipino Industrialist Col Joseph McMicking and its gated villas soon hosted summer soirées packed with the Med eilte (think Mustique overlooking the Rock of Gibraltar). Polo followed thanks to McMicking's nephew, Enrique Zobel, who created the Beach ground in 1965. Fast forward 50 years and there are now 16 fields in this sun-drenched corner of Andalucia. The high-goal action centres on the manicured lawns of the Santa Maria Polo Club, dubbed the Wimbledon of polo grounds. Situated on the banks of the Guadiaro estuary, its fields are divided by paim trees and white canvas parasols to protect visitors from the Spanish sun. What to watch: The International Polo Tournament (part of the Grand Slam), is held annually at Santa Maria, this year from 24 July to 31 August. Dress to (casually) impress: Men can't go far wrong copying the look of polo-playing Raiph Lauren model Nacho Figueras (polo shirt and chinos). Ladies, think chic summer dresses and comfy wedges (it isn't Ascot). Steaks are high: Homesick Argentinian polo players get their protein fixes at Cancha II, which serves up steaks flown in from South America and flamed on a traditional wood-burning grill. The rustic restaurant sits above the Ayala Club's polo grounds, perfect for sundowners while watching the evening chukkas.

Start from scratch: Christian Byrne, from the family that started luxury ski company Powder Byrne, has turned his expertise to summer activities with Polo Valley. With more than 50 ponies, including a free-roaming Shotland, it offers lessons for all abilities. Buy your own stable: La Reserva Club Sotogrande's latest development, El Mirador, still has palatial modern mansions for sale (see page 206). Best by boat: Sotogrande's marina is near the Santa Maria Polo Club and can host yachts up to 70m. sontomoriopolociub.com
